#### Grade 12:

<u>College Decisions</u> - Some colleges have already released application decisions. Be sure to update your school counselor with details. In addition, update your Naviance account with your college information. <u>This video</u> shows you how.

FSA ID - What is an FSA ID? Who Needs an FSA ID? An FSA ID is a username and password that is required to log in to certain U.S. Department of Education (ED) websites. Your FSA ID identifies you as someone who has the right to access your own personal information on ED websites such as the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA®). Beginning with the 2024–25 FAFSA®, all contributors (student, student's spouse, and/or parent) must have their own FSA ID.

<u>Create an FSA ID</u>, please go to <u>studentaid.gov/fsa-id/create-account/launch</u>.

Have you submitted a college application yet? If you are planning on submitting an application and have not completed one yet, be sure to meet with your counselor soon.

#### Grade 9:

<u>Goal Setting</u> - start with something simple. If it feels overwhelming then choose something else. Try these tips
